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### FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

***“What’s worth keeping?  
How much of what we do and how we do it positively  
impacts on the learning of our students?  
It’s not ‘what I do’ but ‘what they learn’.”***

As a staff at EAS we are always keen to learn and improve our craft. This means that the structures we have and processes we carry out allow EAS staff to be lifelong learners who strive to improve outcomes for our students. In Term 2 teachers did a personal audit of their teaching and pedagogy and, as part of the collaborative nature of our learning, staff will have the opportunity this term to reflect on this and carry out ACTION RESEARCH to improve their craft and how this can impact on our students’ learning. As part of this staff will have the opportunity to research and implement High Impact Teaching strategies into their classrooms, then collect evidence and evaluate whether they have positively impacted on the learning of their students.

It greatly takes courage and commitment to continually reflect on one’s personal performance and understand that everyone can get better at what they do. To be able to honestly give and receive feedback, and honestly evaluate our teaching, we have collectively developed a culture that embraces the following ideas:

- All members of the school community have areas of strength
- All members of the school community have areas that need to be strengthened
- It’s never too late to learn
- When beginning new things, we all bring prior knowledge and experience
- Emotions, feelings and attitudes affect learning
- Everyone learns in different ways at different times

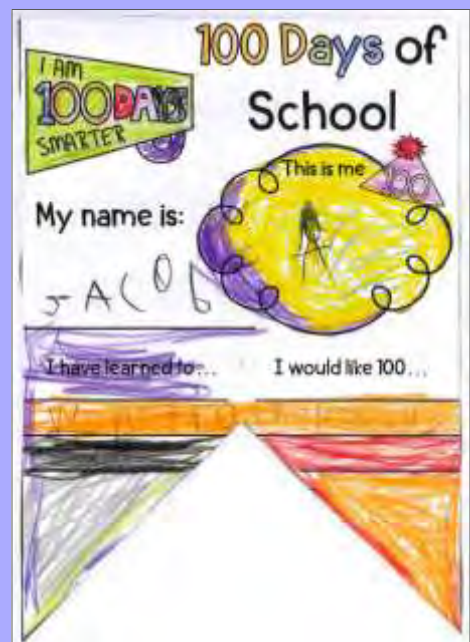
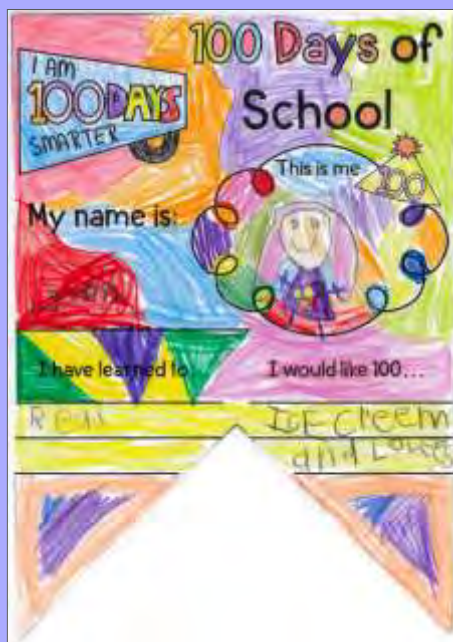
