Catastrophic fire danger days

Our school has detailed plans in place to keep your child safe in the event of a bushfire.

On catastrophic fire danger days in the Mid North fire ban district our school will be **closed** and no one is permitted on site. After school sports or activities will also be cancelled.

Whilst our school's bushfire risk rating is R3 (medium to low risk), we are in close proximity to a nearby R1 or R2 (extreme to very high risk) school/preschool.

This change allows for a consistent approach to the management of school and preschool closures in our immediate area.

If a catastrophic fire danger day is forecast, we will inform you of a closure after 4pm the day before.

If the CFS upgrade the fire danger rating to catastrophic on the day, our school will remain open. This is in line with the department's processes and allows us to more easily manage communication with parents and caregivers in the event that a closure of the school is recommended by the department.

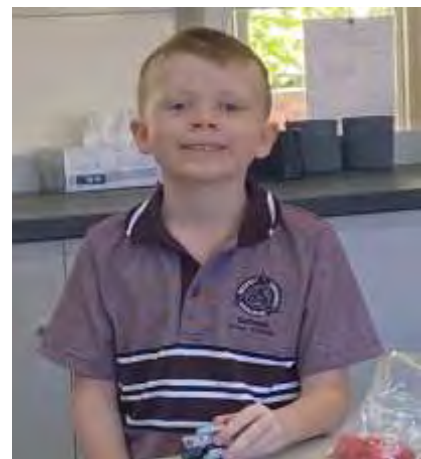

What is Play Therapy?

Play therapy is a systematic, evidence-based, therapeutic approach. Play Therapists are trained to use the powers of play to help children learn about their world and process their experiences. Play is their natural way of expressing themselves, using the toys as their language. A play therapy session typically lasts for 30 - 35 min. It is a 1:1 session between the therapist and child using a range of selected toys.

Play Therapy is offered at your school and in our Tanunda office.

Play Therapy is based upon the fact that play is the child's natural medium of self-expression. It is an opportunity which is given to the child to 'play out' his feelings and problems just as, in certain types of adult therapy, an individual 'talks out' his difficulties.
