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FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Welcome back to Term 2. The first few weeks of this term will be very busy, with NAPLAN, Outdoor Education Surf Camp, Operation Flinders and Parent/Teacher/Student Interviews. All these activities will take students outside of their comfort zone so, as a community, it is important that we focus on and talk to our children about the effort and commitment they put into these activities and the opportunities for learning they took from it.

Year 3,5,7,9 students will participate in NAPLAN tests starting in Week 2. At Eudunda Area School, we use the data, both on a whole school level as well as individually, to plan for the needs of all students. The data is used by staff to gain an understanding of each student's strengths and areas for improvement. Staff will use this data along with other data sets to ensure all students have their individual needs met.

Parents and students had the chance to engage in a 3-way discussion with teachers at Interviews on Tuesday, May 10th. If you were unable to attend or unable to speak with all your child/rens teachers please email or ring me at school, so that we can ensure you have the opportunity to discuss the learning of your child/ren.

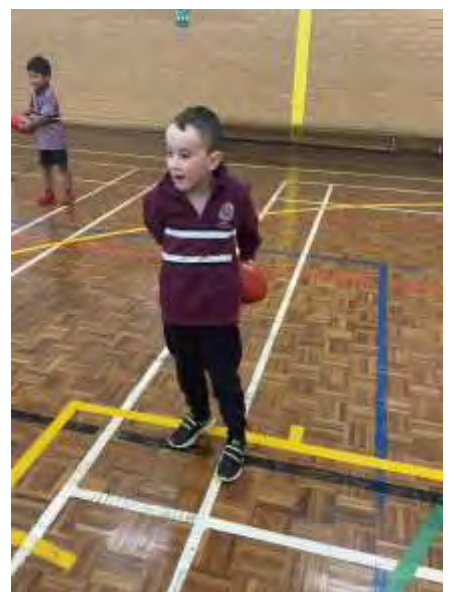
