FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Term 3's are notoriously busy times in schools, and as we get to the end of this term, it is important to take stock of the learning that has occurred at EAS. Staff at EAS when they plan an individual's learning note the following:

- All our students have areas of strength
- All our students have areas that need to be strengthened
- It's never too late for all our students to learn
- When beginning new things, our students bring prior knowledge and experiences that can be implemented into their learning
- Our students have emotions, feelings and attitudes that can affect their learning affect learning
- Our students learn in different ways at different times

So we can better inform each students learning, recently completed NAPLAN and PAT testing results, along with subject results and other diagnostic testing results will provide data that your child's teacher will analyse and evaluate to write programs and tasks that individualise learning in an effort to improve each students learning outcomes.

Your child's NAPLAN results will be sent home via the post. Included with these results is a hand out that has an explanation about NAPLAN tests and how to read and interpret the score your child achieved. If as a parent you would like to me to interpret or discuss these results, please feel free to ring the school and make an appointment.

For Year 12 students, Term 3 is the last complete term of schooling for them before they encounter final assessments and examinations, in fact many subjects required moderation materials to be completed and sent to the SACE Board prior to the end of the term. If you are a parent of a Year 12 student, please take the time to chat to them about the workload they have. Feel free to remind them that the effort and decisions they make will be reflected in their results, but most importantly support them to complete the year as best they can.

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Principals Report

For all students, the holidays provide a period of reflection on the effort and decisions they have made so far this year and how these choices have impacted on their learning. Term 3 gives students the opportunity to make alterations to these choices if required. Research indicates that there is a strong connection between regular and punctual attendance and student success. So, if a student was to miss 1 day a fortnight over the year, they would miss 3 weeks of education over a year. It is important that parents contact the school on 85811500 if their children are absent so the school can keep accurate records of attendance.
