


Term 3 Art Year 7-10

During Term 3 Year 9&10 students studied Hans Heysen and his landscape artworks. Students focused on botanical illustrations along with developing their skills of constructing a landscape composition. The artworks featured were created using a reference photo from the Flinders Ranges and acrylic paints. Students created their own colour palettes from mixing colours to get earthy tones and finished by adding fine detail to their paintings (hard to view from these images). This class have since moved onto a ceramics unit which students begun by learning hand building techniques in the last few weeks of Term 3. Year 7 students focused on art elements and principles for the term by completing some 'value' ice-cream portraits created using white pencil on black card. Students followed a grid method to get accurate proportions. Towards the end of the term students began the topic of surrealism and used watercolour paints to create 11x16" portraits using research and their imagination.
