## FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Transitions are an active process of continuity and change as children move into the next level of schooling. At EAS, the transition process occurs continuously throughout the year. Our transition process is effective because we establish positive relationships and connections, so that all students and families are familiar with and connected to the school prior to school starting. This helps build open communication and trust between the school and the community. Over the last few weeks we, as part of the ongoing transition process have had the privilege of orientating our new Reception and Year 7 students to EAS.

The Year 7 students have been involved in their visits over the last two weeks, culminating with a parent student information night and BBQ on Tuesday, November 22nd. It was great to see all parents and transitioning students on this night and provide them with information to help ease any anxiety they may have about transitioning into high school.

The children from the Eudunda Community Preschool are completing visits for this term and today (November, 23rd) have their first full day visit. It was great to see them comfortable in their new surrounds, especially as they were dancing up a storm with Miss Engel and Mrs Mosey.

Roundtable assessments allow parents to come in and learn alongside their children in a real world context. I invite other interested community members to come into the school and see the impact that this type of assessment has on children's learning. Year 9 Roundtable will be held on Wednesday, December 7th. The focus for the year 9s is on sustainability. The Year 8 students complete their roundtable assessment on Thursday, December 8th and the Year 8s focus on careers and the world of work. The dates will be the last day of formal schooling for these year level groups.

Year 10 & 11 students will finish the school year on Thursday, December 1st. The school has a SFD for all on Friday, December 2nd.

Week 9 is Activities Week, students in the secondary years will select activities for the week and these will run on a set timetable. These will be the only options open to children during this week. Primary classes will run as normal during this time.
