PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

What a jammed packed couple of weeks we have had since our last newsletter. Definitely the highlight was last week's Sports Day which emphasised the true spirit of our school. Students participated in a large array of events whilst doing so to the best of their ability. There were a huge number of records broken illustrating the high level of talent that exists within our school. A massive shout out again to Mr Pfitzner, Mrs Shannon and Miss Engel on their superb organisation of the event, it ran like a well-oiled train. Congratulations to Dunstan on your win this year, it looks like Light will be hitting the track a bit harder next year!

Over the last two weeks the Year 3, Year 5, Year 7 and Year 9 students have been involved in NAPLAN testing. Whatever the outcome, students should be proud that they put their best foot forward in each of the tests. A massive thank you to Mrs Shannon for co-ordinating this mammoth event.

Last week on the Pupil Free Day, our staff were involved in Child Protection Curriculum training. The Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC) is a child safety and respectful relationships curriculum for children and young people from age 3 to Year 12. The KS:CPC provides age and developmentally appropriate strategies to help children and young people keep themselves safe. It has gained a world class reputation due to its depth of content, breadth of learning, contemporary nature and the requirement for explicit training. The KS:CPC is mandated in all Department for Education preschools and schools for children and young people from age 3 to Year 12.



The Education department has a legal obligation to safeguard children and young people. The Safeguarding Children & young People policy outlines that:-

- all children and young people in department preschools and schools will access the KS:CPC each year
- the KS:CPC is taught by educators who are trained in its use.

15 students from our senior secondary team plus 5 students from Kapunda High School started their 5 day Barista and Safe Food Handling course this week. This opportunity will enable them to gain 10 SACE credits plus a Nationally Recognised Certificate. We were able to access a grant to cover each of the student's course fees which was an added bonus.

A letter has been sent home this week in regards to Parent/Student/Teacher interviews. We strongly encourage everyone to attend, as this is an integral part of helping students to move forward with their learning journey and to discuss any concerns you may have.

This Week we welcomed Harry Wuttke and Joanne Burge to the SSO team we are really excited to have you on board and I am sure our students will benefit from you support in the classroom.

Our second stage of our facelift occurred this week, with the old saggy fence surrounding the playground being replaced. It has had a slight change to the shape in preparation for phase 3.....

A special congratulations to Mr Max Neville and Amalie Meaney on their recent engagement, we couldn't be happier for you both.

Our senior students are embracing the extracurricular opportunities which have been offered at Eudunda Area School throughout the term. These include participation in school and interschool sporting events, leadership activities, presentations and training. This week, 2 Year 11 Agriculture students travelled to Undalya with Mr Neville for some hands-on experience, pregnancy scanning ewes and 14 students commenced their Industry Taster Experience with the Adelaide Institute of Hospitality. During this 5-day course, successful students will gain four units of competency from the Basic Food Industry Skill Set including Safe Food Preparation and 'Coffee Making' (Barista skills). Four students from Kapunda have joined our students for this initiative. Students will complete three days this week and two days in Week 10.



Senior students will receive regular emails from me this year, especially in reference to their future pathway 'post school'. These include:-

- Work Experience opportunities
- Apprenticeships/Traineeships - full-time and school-based
- Industry Activities
- Immersion Days (will be run as a school activity if there is enough interest)
- Holiday programmes
- Tertiary Information sessions (often on-line)
- Career/Tertiary Expos and Open Days (some will be attended as a school group)
- Study 'hints'

These emails will not be of interest for all students, but some may be useful. It is important that students are proactive and follow up any information or 'links' that are of interest to them (and delete the rest!).

Year 12 Intervention

In Week 5, I met individually with Year 12 students to discuss their progress, SACE pattern, completion goals, possible career aspirations and requirements needed to achieve these goals. Many students are on track with their subject requirements, meeting deadlines and successfully completing tasks, of late, however there are a few students who have become disengaged and are 'falling behind'. If teachers have concerns, they will contact you to inform you of missed deadlines or to outline their concerns and strategies to support 'your child' moving forward. Staff will often communicate student progress/achievement via Daymap. These comments can be accessed via the parent portal on the school's website (or students can access Daymap and share this information with you). It is important to note that full-time Year 12 students are unlikely to be successful at Stage 2 level without dedicating some quality time to independent study, this includes using study lessons effectively and dedicating some time to homework (outside of school hours).

Parent-Teacher Interviews are scheduled in Week 11, Tuesday 11 April from 4pm – 8pm; This is a great opportunity to meet with teachers and discuss student progress, application, and achievement. A letter explaining the booking process will be distributed to families soon.
