## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome to Week 10! With only two weeks to go, and these being shorter weeks due to Easter, I feel a sense of pride with what we have all achieved in such a hectic term. I am so proud of staff and students and the amazing learnings that have occurred this term and I have no doubt everyone is looking forward to a much needed break.

### GROUNDS AND FACILITIES

In the next couple of weeks major work will begin on the next phase of our front of school face lift. The Regional Council of Goyder have agreed to remove the pine trees near the school buses to accommodate a new parent drive through and drop off zone for our students, this will include a safe area for students to wait to be collected, The new zone will allow drivers to have an improved line of sight of students coming and going between school. Other major works to our grounds will also be occurring during the holidays and early next term, so stay tuned on Facebook for updates.

### ICT UPDATES

One of our focus areas this year is to update and increase our ICT facilities and equipment. We have set up an ICT committee who monitor equipment, programs and discuss staff proposals and requests. This term we have purchased 23 Ipad's (10 x Year 1/2, 10 x Year 3/4, 1 x Art, 2 x Middle School English), they are currently being set up for use next term. We have also ordered 14 x Apple computers for the Art Room, these computers will have the latest technology for Visual Art Design programs and these too will be set up during the holiday period.



## PARENT USE OF SOCIAL MEDIA

We ask that parents do not take photos of other students and post them onto social media. We are required to seek parent permission to post on different media platforms and have a list of who does and who does not wish to for this to occur. We ask that families please respect this wish because as a school we ensure that we take photos of all special occasions and share with families.

It was so warming to witness the special Autism Awareness Day that we celebrated last week. Thank you to Vanessa O'Brien for making this event such an inclusive and special experience for students, staff and parents.

## EARLY FINISH

According to the DECD Enterprise Agreement, staff are currently working 5 minutes a day longer than is required, therefore after consultation with Governing Council, we will be slightly altering the end of the day starting from Term 2. Students will now have a 5 minute increase to their instruction time and a decrease of 10 minutes to their administration time. Any communication to students in the afternoon will still occur via the teachers students have in the last lesson of the day.

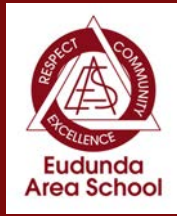
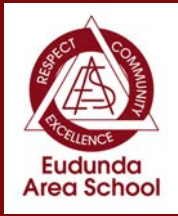

## National Careers Institute

The National Careers Institute, has been funded by the Australian Government to deliver additional support to senior secondary students (years 10, 11 & 12) as they navigate their choices post-school. Resources have been developed to help young people with their options regardless of their interests and whether they are decided or undecided about their future pathway.

- The Parents and guardians guide provides support for parents and guardians to start conversations about life after school.
- The School Leavers Information Service is free for young people aged 15 to 24 years, providing them with access to a qualified career practitioner for tailored assistance with their education, training or employment options.
