## GIRLS KNOCKOUT FOOTBALL



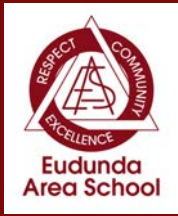

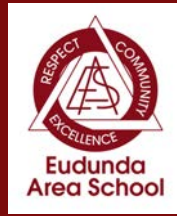
# MOTHERS DAY AFTERNOON TEA

## FUTURE PATHWAYS

We have many activities planned for our secondary students in June.

June 1: Our Year 11 students have been invited to attend The Road Awareness Program (RAP) presented by the Metropolitan Fire Service. Students will travel to Kapunda High School with Mr Neville and Ms Brown next Thursday afternoon.

June 2: Our Year 9 students will travel to the Tonsley Innovation District with Mr Pfitzner and Mr Dempsey for a 'STEM immersion experience'. The Tonsley Innovation District, a former car manufacturing plant, is now home to leading businesses and start-ups, as well as TAFE SA's Building & Construction Centre and Flinders University's College of Science & Engineering. Tonsley Innovation District is the largest STEM education resource in the state. Tonsley hosts the careers of today and tomorrow in four focus sectors:

- **Health, medical devices and assistive technologies**
- **Cleantech and renewable energy**
- **Automation, software and simulation**
- **Mining and energy services.**

June 7: Uni SA are visiting us to present information sessions for Year 10, Year 11 & Year 12 students.

June 9: Industry immersion activity presented by the Motor Trades association (MTA) for the Year 10 students and the senior Pedal Prix team. In addition to a 'Careers in Auto' presentation (including general information about the job application process), students will take part in some interactive activities.

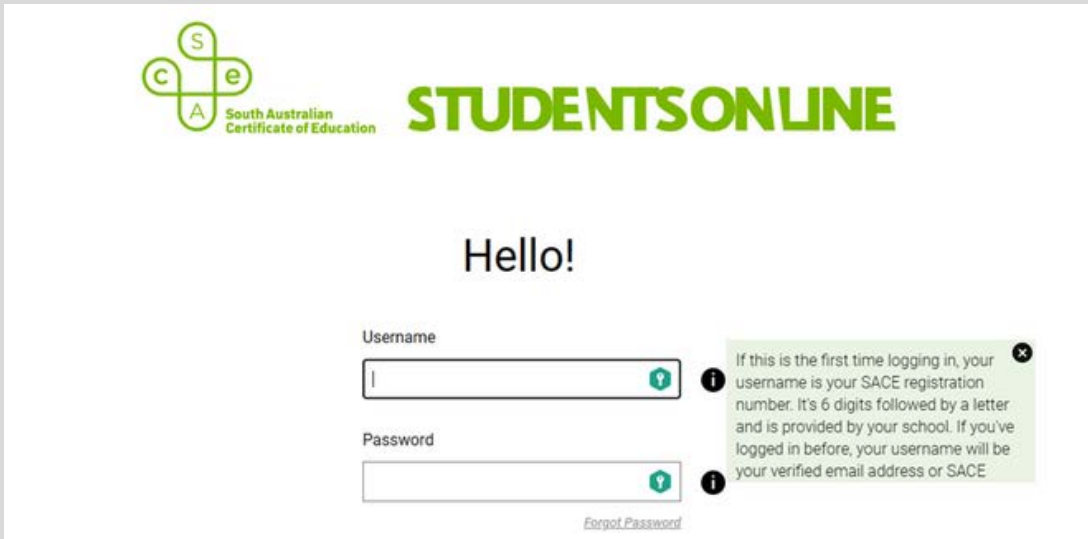
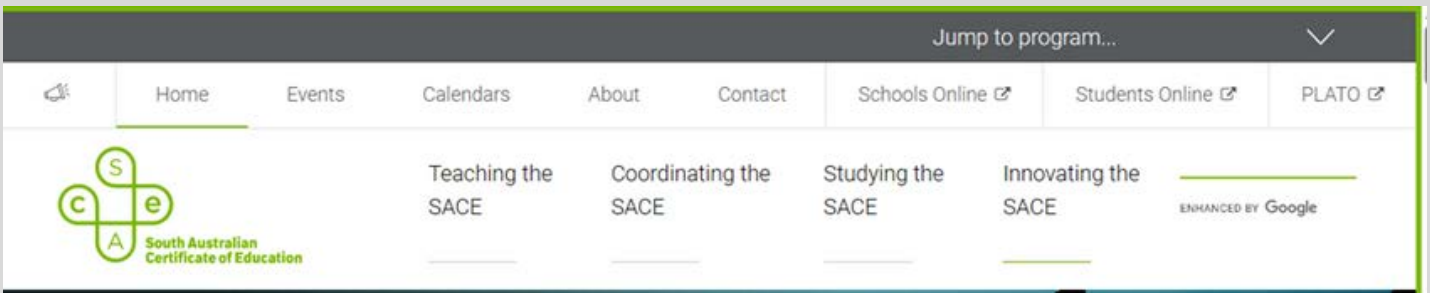

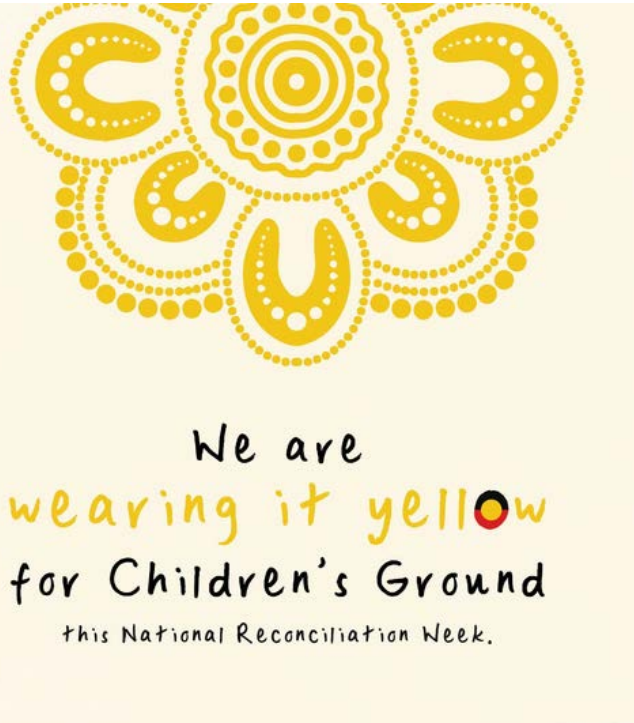
The SACE Board runs two results cycles per year. Students can access their own personal results (mid July and late December). Year 10, 11 & 12 students are encouraged to log into Students Online, to create a password and hence access their enrolment and results information whenever they wish. Students logging on for the first time need their SACE registration number and 4-digit PIN – day and month of birth (DDMM). At lunch time, students were able to pretend to milk a cow using some very clever props. All students enjoyed the day and are keen to learn more about the process of how milk gets from the dairy to the shops.
