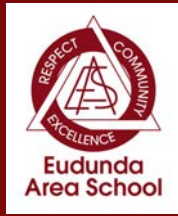

Welcome back to another exciting term of learning and growth! We hope students had a restful break and are ready to dive back into their studies for another action packed term!

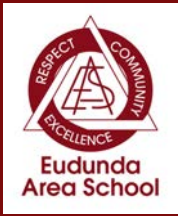
NAPLAN

Last week NAPLAN results for Year 3, 5, 7 & 9 students were sent home with students. From 2023, new standards were introduced to NAPLAN reporting. This reporting replaces the previous numerical NAPLAN reporting bands and National minimum standards. Education Ministers agreed 2023 was the right time to introduce this change alongside moving NAPLAN to March. Proficiency standards provide clear information on student achievement. They are set at a challenging but reasonable level expected for the child at the time of NAPLAN testing, based mainly on what has been taught in previous years of schooling. There are 4 proficiency levels:

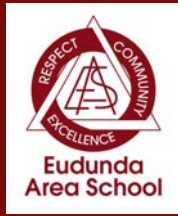
- Exceeding: The student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.
- Strong: The student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.
- Developing: The student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.
- Needs additional support: The student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.

As a school we will now analyse student results which helps us better identify students who need greater challenges or extra support. We also use these results to identify strengths and areas of need in teaching programs and to set goals in literacy and numeracy. If you have any further questions or concerns regarding your child's NAPLAN report, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher.

GROUNDS

During the holidays major works occurred with our new drive through and pick up zone near on completion. All the landscaping has now been finalised, and we are just waiting on local Council to erect signage. In coming weeks students and parents will be able to utilise the new area. Council has scheduled to curb and seal of the road mid next year, however we will be able to use the road prior to this occurring.

The Art Room and Room 5 were painted during the holidays and the new STEM Room, Primary teachers' offices and the Gymnasium entrance have new lino put on the floors. We are just waiting on new furniture for the STEM Room and then it will be fully functioning for our Primary students.

BYOD

As the world evolves at an ever fluctuating pace, we are as a school embracing these changes head on. Our vision is to ensure that ALL EAS students have access to the latest technologies to guarantee that they are moving forward. Therefore, in 2024 all students from Year 7-12 will be required to Bring Your Own Device (BYOD).

BYOD refers to a policy that allows students to bring their personal devices, such as a laptop, to school for educational purposes. We understand that this might be a new concept for some parents, but we believe that it offers a multitude of benefits for your child's education and overall learning experience.

By allowing students to bring their own devices, they can access a variety of educational resources, apps and websites that cater to their individual needs and interests. They have the benefit of being able to access these resources both at school and at home. This empowers them to take control of their own learning journey and enhances their motivation to explore and discover new knowledge. Some students already have a laptop, therefore this will not be of impact to them. However, for those students who will be required to purchase a laptop, we have set up a portal for parents to purchase a device for their child. To cater for all families, there are three different price options students can choose from. An information package has been attached for your reference. Alternatively, families can purchase a laptop externally providing it matches all the required IT specifications – please check with the school prior to purchasing a device.

We will be holding an information session on Wednesday, 30th August, at 4pm, with 'edunet' who will explain how the portal works. They will also have the three devices on display for families to look at and ask questions. Some of the benefits of purchasing through this portal are;

- EAS will provide a \$50 credit per student
- Varied finance options
- 12 months interest free
- Technical support through the school
- Certified education models from leading brands

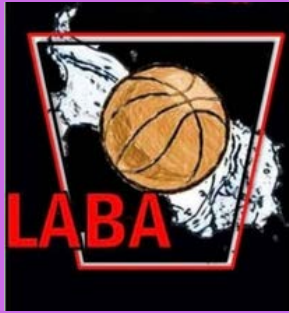
