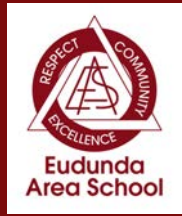
### Staffing

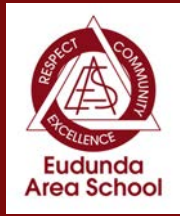
### Year 7 Transition

# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT CONTINUED



## Grounds

Late in 2022 the Department for Education deemed Building 1 roof (Admin Building) irreparable. As a result of this decision the entire roof of this building will be replaced. This will involve the tiles being removed and the roof being replaced with a Colourbond roof. This project will be at no cost to our school and completely covered by the Department.

We understand that any construction or renovation work can cause disruptions and we recognise the importance of minimising these disruptions to ensure a conducive learning environment for our students. We have been working closely with the construction team to develop a comprehensive plan aimed at reducing the impact on student learning as much as possible.

There are three stages to this project;

- Stage 1 approximately 2-3 weeks – classes that will be affected will be the intervention class, Art Room and Primary STEM Room – these classes will be moved into alternative classrooms
- Stage 2 (approximately 2-3 weeks) – Room 5, 6, 7 – these classes will be moved into alternative classrooms
- Stage 3 (approximately 6 weeks) – Administration building and Library

The construction team will adhere to strict safety protocols to ensure the well-being of our students and staff are being met. Construction areas will be securely cordoned off and closely monitored to prevent any accidents or unauthorised access. These areas are completely out of bounds to staff and students.

While we anticipate that most disruptions will be minimal, we understand that unforeseen circumstances may arise. In such cases, we will communicate promptly with you and provide any necessary updates or adjustments to our plans.

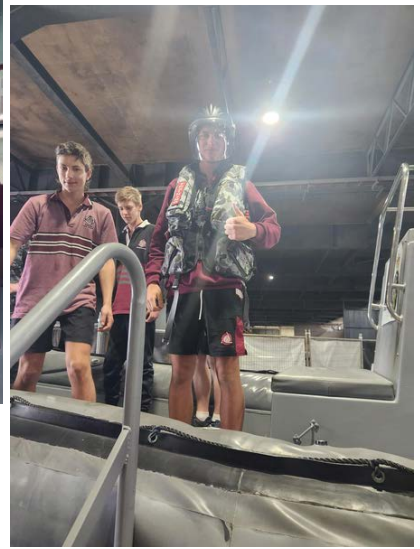


## GYMKHANA

Dakota Launer, Farrah Launer and Montana Smith participated in the Inter-School Gymkhana in Clare. Well done girls.





**What is Play Therapy?**

Play is the natural language of children and toys are their words.

Child Centred Play Therapy is a humanistic/relationship-based approach, working therapeutically with children using the child's preferred communication.

Play Therapy is an intervention approach for children aged 2-12. Older children may be considered.

The Play Therapy model uses Child Centred Play Therapy, meaning that during our sessions the child is in complete control of the play.

Children may not have the verbal knowledge and emotional regulation to express their feelings through words but they can 'play out' those feelings.

**What areas of difficulty can Play Therapy support?**

- Trauma
- Aggressive and Oppositional Behaviours
- Speech and Language Delays
- Attachment
- Anxiety
- ASD
- Developmental Delays
- Social Difficulties
- Grief and Loss
- Fears
- ADHD
- Self Esteem issues

**What changes can you expect with Play Therapy?**

Through the process of discovery children learn to develop:

- Self-respect
- Responsibility
- Problem solving and resolution skills
- Self-control and self-direction
- Self-regulation
- Social skills
- Greater self-esteem
- Confidence and resilience
- Choice making
