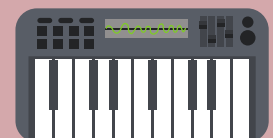

What is Play Therapy?

Play is the natural language of children and toys are their words. Child Centred Play Therapy is a humanistic/relationship-based approach, working therapeutically with children using the child's preferred communication.

Play Therapy is an intervention approach for children aged 2-12. Older children may be considered.

The Play Therapy model used is Child Centred Play Therapy, meaning that during our sessions the child is in complete control of the play.

Children may not have the verbal knowledge and emotional regulation to express their feelings through words but they can 'play out' those feelings.

What areas of difficulty can Play Therapy support?

- Trauma
- Aggressive and Oppositional Behaviours
- Speech and Language Delays
- Attachment
- Anxiety
- ASD
- Developmental Delays
- Social Difficulties
- Grief and Loss
- Fears
- ADHD
- Self Esteem Issues

What changes can you expect with Play Therapy?

Through the process of discovery children learn to develop:

- Self-respect
- Responsibility
- Problem solving and resolution skills
- Self-control and self-direction
- Self-regulation
- Social Skills
- Greater self-esteem
- Confidence and resilience
- Choice making
